

The scripture text for my homily that day was 1 Corinthians 11:28, and focused on the worthy participation in the Eucharist, and our unity in Christ.

*But let a man examine himself, and so let him eat of that bread, and drink of that cup. -1 Corinthians xi. 28.*




Rev. Willis' well read set of the Ante-Nicene Fathers

In recent days Archbishop Gordon has been busy finalizing his schedule for the rest of the Church year. These are exciting times in the Orthodox Anglican Church, and the Orthodox Anglican Communion. There are new deacons to ordain, new priests to ordain, and new missions being organized. Overseas the Orthodox Anglican Communion is growing and this has necessitated a visit to Africa. Lord willing, Archbishop Gordon will travel to East Africa this Fall, and then travel on to Jerusalem to meet with bishops from around the world.

Using Exodus 17 as the text for the homily at his enthronement, Archbishop Gordon encouraged Orthodox Anglicans to support the leadership of the church.
